Sir/Madam,

1. To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Shri Jagadguru Gurusiddeshwar Co-Operative Society's Sahakar Maharshi, Shri B. A. Patil Ayurvedic Medical College, Tal-Gokak, Dist. Belgaum, Ghataprabha-591310, Karnataka (Inst. Id-AYU0066)** inspection was conducted on **08.04.2025 and 09.04.2025 in Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the permission with **100 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020**.
2. Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. **On careful examination of the assessment report it is found that your college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria, due to the following shortcoming:**

a) Teaching staffs :-

Availability of teaching staff is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{43}{45} \times 100\% = 95.55\%$

3. Further, the assessment report was duly placed before the 124th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 29.05.2025 and Board concluded that the college is fulfilling the criteria as mentioned in

the policy letter for assessment of Ayurveda colleges, dated 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025. Further, the Board also observed that the college is meeting the notified & requisite criteria for the issuance of the extended permission as the college has been permitted for last three consecutive years with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) Course as per regulation 54(2) of MESA&R for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024. Accordingly, the Board decided as follows:

- a) To issue extended permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course in accordance with Regulation 54 (2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26.

"DECISION"

4. Therefore, Shri Jagadguru Gurusiddeshwar Co-Operative Society's Sahakar Maharshi, Shri B. A. Patil Ayurvedic Medical College, Tal-Gokak, Dist. Belgaum, Ghataprabha-591310, Karnataka (Inst. Id-AYU0066) is hereby granted with:-

Extended permission in UG (BAMS) course with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 54 (2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024.

The aforementioned decision is issued under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following requirements shall be fulfilled:-

- I. It is informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 seats in UG Course** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
- II. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
5. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
6. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
7. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
8. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college as per Regulation 55 (2) of MESA&R UG Ayurveda 2024 and the compliance report shall be submitted before 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
 - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirement of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standard of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022.
 - iv) The compliance of shortcoming mentioned in para- 02.
9. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical

Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made there under shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made there under. Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM Act, 2020 shall not be applicable.

Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Shri Jagadguru Gurusiddeshwar Co-Operative Society's SahakarMaharshi, Shri JGCHS Ayurvedic Medical College, Tal-Gokak, Dist. Belgaum, Ghataprabha-591310, Karnataka(Inst. ID AYU0066) with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) Course inspection of your College was conducted on 22.02.2024 & 23.02.2024 in hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the Conditional permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25.
2. Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under.
3. Thereafter, the assessment report was placed in the 90th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 17.05.2024. On careful examination of the assessment report it is found that your college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria due to the following shortcoming.

a) **Teaching staffs:-**

- i. Availability of total teaching staff for UG is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{42}{45} \times 100\% = 93.33\%$ (Excluding Excess and considering visitor observation report)

b) **Hospital staffs :-**

- ii. Availability of hospital staff is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{69}{70} \times 100\% = 98.57\%$.

The college shall submit an undertaking in form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provident Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations

5. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 60 UG (BAMS) seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority of State/UT Government as designated by Central Government vide letter F.No.L.11011/02/2020-EP (1) dated 26.10.2020 for A.Y. 2020-21 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.

6. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under IMCC Act & Regulations made thereunder.

7. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Board of Governors, CCIM and the Central Government.

8. The following requirements should have been fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2020 to get permission for the session 2021-22:

- (i) all the Requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
- (ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda); and
- (iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled *in toto*
- (iv) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 for grant of permission to PG courses.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to the then Department's order No.R.17011/57/2014-EP (IM-1) dated 03.07.2014 related to admission matter for the year 2014-15 intimating certain shortcomings for rectification for consideration of the case for the 2015-16 session.

2. The CCIM had carried out an inspection of the institution on 11-12.02.2015 to reassess the available facilities of teaching and practical training as well as to verify the compliance submitted by the college and forwarded its recommendations and report to this Ministry.

3. The recommendations and visitation report of the CCIM have been carefully examined in terms of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standard Requirements of Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2012 read with amendment Regulations of 2013, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made thereunder and as per approval of the Hon'ble MoS (IC) for the UG/PG course(s) for grant of conditional permission for the academic session 2015-16 vide Ministry letter No.R.11011/01/2015-EP (IM-1) dated 05.05.2015 (available at Ministry's website <indianmedicine.nic.in>) and it is found that the College is fulfilling the notified and approved criteria as follows:-

(i) Teachers:

- a. For UG course: 100% eligible teachers, 15 Higher Faculties (Professor + Reader) in 14 Departments in the college, 1 P/R + 1L in each of 13 Dept. & 1P+1R+1L in Kayachikitsa and 1L of Sanskrit and 09 part time teachers up to 60 UG seats;
- b. For PG course(s): In addition to the UG course, 1 Higher Faculty + 1 Lecturer in the concerned PG department, fulfillment of teacher-student ratio (1:3 for Professor, 1:2 for Reader and 1:1 for Lecturer);

(ii) Beds in hospital:

- a. Minimum 60 beds in hospital of college for UG course in case of up to 60 intake capacity;
- b. Minimum 100 bedded hospital for PG Colleges of Ayurveda and additional beds in 1:4 student-bed ratio for each PG clinical seat over the total requirement of beds for UG students intake capacity;

(iii) Minimum 120 patients per day in OPD during the year 2014 for up to 60 UG seats;(iv) 40% bed occupancy for UG College and 50% for Colleges with PG course/s in IPD during the year 2014;(v) Equipment and instruments: Minimum 90% of required equipment as specified under the schedule VII of MSR;

(vi) Fulfillment of provisions including staff requirement under relevant PG Education Regulations; and

(vii) Other infrastructure and staff required as per the MSR Regulations of 2012 read with amendment Regulations of 2013, in addition to above requirements for grant of permission for a period not exceeding five years.

4. It has, therefore, been decided by the Central Government to *grant permission* under section 13C of the IMCC Act, 1970 *for a period not exceeding five years* to Shri Jagadguru Gurusiddeshwar Co-Operative Hospital Society's Ayurvedic Medical College, Ghataprabha, Tal: Gadag, Dist. Belgaum, Karnataka with 50 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 10 PG courses viz. 

In continuation to the Ministry's letter of even No. dated 08.01.2015 wherein a Letter of Intent was issued to the college with respect to the proposal submitted to the Central Government as cited above, I am directed to say that after careful consideration of the recommendations of the CCIM in terms of the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant regulations made thereunder and approved norms for academic session 2015-16, which were circulated vide Ministry's letter No.R.11011/01/2015-EP (IM-1) dated 05.05.2015 (available on Ministry's website <indianmedicine.nic.in>); permission of the Central Government is hereby granted to **Shri Jagadguru Gurusiddeshwar Co-Operative Hospital Society's Ayurvedic Medical College, Ghataprabha, Tal: Gadag, Dist. Belgaum, Karnataka** to increase the admission capacity from 50 to 60 seats (10 additional seats) in existing UG (BAMS) course, from the academic session 2015-16 under Section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970. Therefore, the college may take admission for the increased 10 UG (BAMS) seats as mentioned above from the academic session 2015-16 to the academic session 2019-20 along with the UG (BAMS) course with 50 seats.

2.
